with **Dr. GREGORY CAJETE**

"OG Science of corn calendars, seed ceremonies, & sun daggers"

It was a warm late spring morning, just before solstice, filming on Treaty 4 Lands within the beautiful Fort Qu'Appelle Valley.

We were grateful to speak with Dr. Gregory Cajete, Tewa from Santa Clara Pueblo, New Mexico about how Indigenous Science is truly the OG (original) science and his life work of weaving together Indigenous and Western science. We spoke about the connections between corn, seeds, and the cosmos, biophilia versus biophobia, creation stories and science, being in relationship with plants and animals, sun daggers and the Solstice Project, and quantum thought.

SHOWNOTES:

PUEBLO REVOLT of 1680

- -gained sovereignty over homeland to retain culture, ceremonies, and languages
- -they were less impacted by colonization

GROWING UP ON THE LAND

- -learning about plants and medicines from grandmother, on the land
- -"I was always outside"
- -connecting with the natural agricultural cycle
- -dances, ceremonies that represent different cycles of the corn- the corn calendar https://www.cloudchiefcompany.com/kachina-and-calendar-of-hopi-ceremonies
- -being in connection with the natural world is foundational knowledge, an internalization of a passion to learn from and with the Land

BIOPHILIA

- -the innate human tendency to be drawn to and connect with nature and the Land. It is the LOVE of Nature.

- -Wilson's deep connection with ants (which got Cajete interested in his research because of his cultural connection with ants) began with his fascination with ant communication through chemicals and insect parent care

BIOPHOBIA

- -the fear of nature
- -Western/global science often requires a disconnect between the reality of the Land and the sanitary lab, evoking a type of fear of nature while also creating a hierarchy of humans being better than nature. Doing science in a lab disconnected from relationality, the land, and the web of life. Indigenous science is being within these relationships, within the web, on the land, with the insect and animal ancestors.

PLANTS have a SPIRIT

- -they have a spirit, they give humans life, we have a responsibility to the plants. This is part of the human contract!

NATURAL CYCLES

-seed, plant, hunting/animal migration cycles

LOOK TO THE MOUNTAIN (book) by G. Cajete

- -science in school didn't include science of the Land
- -using plants for food and medicine for survival- connecting biology with Indigenous knowledge
- -science is relational, it is about relationships to animals and plants and beyond

BUREAU of AMERICAN ETHNOLOGY (1895)

-at this time, situated at the Smithsonian, and sent out anthropologists, astronomers, biologists, archaeologists, botanists, ethnologists to Indian Country to "collect knowledge," under the assumption that Indigenous people would disappear within the next generation -it is a collection of very comprehensive knowledge

-they reported back all the knowledge they "found" and documented it

- -seven orientations of scientific knowledge (by G. Cajete). in "Look to the Mountatin," pg 193-203
- -Seven Directions: Centre (heart), East, West, South, North, Below, Above

-the sun daggers also show the 18.6 year lunar cycle

-instead of a "dagger of sunlight" here it is a "dagger of moonlight" during a full moon!
